Articulate the cohesion policy, the governance systems and the cross-border territorial projects



The current situation on cross-border cooperation is dominated by the development of the 2014-2020 Cohesion Policy framework as well as the definition of a French policy on its borders. In this context, the Transfrontier Operational Mission (MOT) has received a grant from the technical assistance programme EUROP'ACT in order to draft a methodological guide whose aim is to improve the coordination between the cohesion policy, the governance systems and the cross-border territorial projects.

The conclusions of this work will contribute to the improvement of the French cross-border cooperation framework, and are addressed to government agencies, bodies of programmes, sub-national authorities, and generally to all players involved in cross-border cooperation.

The methodological guide must contribute to:

- Better articulate the future French Partnership Agreement and the cross-border cooperation programmes with cross-border territorial dynamics and projects;
- Promote the collaborative development, by France and the neighbouring countries, of the cross-border aspects of their respective Partnership Agreement;
- E Coordinate cross-border cooperation programmes with other territorial cooperation programmes and, by and large, other cohesion programmes and territorial policies;
- Articulate the monitoring systems on French cross-border policies with those established under the cohesion policy;
- Increase the importance of the territorial approach in the development of the French Partnership Agreement and of the cross-border cooperation programmes, in order to stimulate and better meet the needs of the territories.

This project must aim to:

- Offer an overview of the monitoring systems on cross-border cooperation at all levels and their impact on the development, implementation and sustainability of cooperation projects;
- Identify and analyse the weaknesses and bottlenecks of the system as a whole;
- = Highlight the factors of improvement of this system;
- Prepare recommendations meant to streamline and improve the operational framework.

This study notably comprises:

- A literature review of documents concerning the Operational Programmes, cooperation structures, cross-border projects, etc.;
- An analysis of a sample of projects;
- Interviews with the players involved in cross-border cooperation on all French borders;
- A targeted consultation the MOT network;
- The organisation and participation in a meeting between the French and Italian national and sub-national administrations in charge of Cohesion Policy and cross-border cooperation.
